



## First Aid Supplies

### I. Policy

California State University, Fullerton (CSUF) and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) require that adequate first aid supplies be available to employees at their job location. Campus departments are responsible for maintaining adequate first aid supplies.

### II. Authority

Code of Federal Regulations, 29 CFR 1910.151 and the California Code of Regulations, Title 8, Section 3400.

### III. Scope

The table below lists the minimum required components required by OSHA for small worksites. When larger or multiple operations are being conducted at the same location, the department(s) should determine the need for additional first aid kits at the worksite. Class A kits are designed to deal with the most common types of workplace injuries. The assortment and quantity of supplies included in the kits were chosen based upon reviews of workplace incidents requiring first aid treatment, similar international standards and current injury treatment practices.

6.	Burn Dressing (Gel Soaked; 1/32 oz.)	1
7.	Burn Treatment	1
8.	Cold Pack (4 x 5 in.)	10
9.	Eye Covering (With means of attachment; 2.9 sq. in.)	2
10.	Eye/Skin Wash (1 fl. oz.)	1
11.	First Aid Guide	1
12.	Hand Sanitizer	6
13.	Medical Exam Gloves	2 pair
14.	Roller Bandage (2 in. x 4 yd.)	1
15.	Scissors	1
16.	Sterile Pad (3 x 3 in.)	2
17.	Trauma Pad (5 x 9 in.)	2
18.	Triangular Bandage (40 x 40 x 56 in.)	1
